

The Harvard Case, the Future of Race-Conscious Admissions, and Impact on the Pipeline

Description:

Harvard's admissions policy has been in the spotlight since a 2018 trial brought on behalf of Asian American students who claimed the way in which they were ranked was discriminatory.

Harvard won the case, but it has continued to make its way through the appeals process, and last month the Supreme Court of the United States announced it would take up the case in its next term, along with a similar lawsuit against the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Experts on the subject will discuss the long term legal and societal implications of a Supreme Court decision and its impact on corporate America's pipeline.
