- 1. On the home tab, click the **Junk** drop down menu  $\Re$  ~
- 2. Then click Junk E-mail Options 🔀 Junk E-mail Options...
- 3. Navigate to the Safe Recipients tab and click the Add... button

4. The "From" field is where you'll specify what's getting whitelisted. In Gmail, you can specify either a specific email address (e.g. <u>events@mcca.com</u>), or you can whitelist the entire MCCA domain by omitting everything before the at symbol (e.g. @mcca.com).

The former will whitelist one specific email address while the latter whitelists anyone who is sending emails from MCCA.
